Boston Children's Hospital Poop Group Toileting Skills Checklist

Instructions: Below is a list of skills needed for effective toileting. Some of these might be things your child has never learned, while others are things may be very easy for them. Please mark these not just as skills that your child is generally familiar with, but what they do consistently without arguing and caregiver support.

Sits on a toilet (big or small) for 1 minute with diaper/pull-up			
Sits on a toilet (big or small) for 3 minutes <u>with</u> diaper/pull- up			
Sits on toilet (small or big) in pull-up with hole in it			
Sits on a toilet (big or small) <u>without</u> diaper/pullup for 10 seconds			
Sits on a toilet (big or small) <u>without</u> diaper/pullup for 1 minute			
Sits on a toilet (big or small) <u>without</u> diaper/pullup for 3 minutes

Poops in a squatting position			
Poops in the bathroom into diaper/pullup (far from toilet)			
Poops in the bathroom into diaper/pullup (next to toilet)			
Poops in bathroom into diaper/pullup (on toilet)			
Poops when prompted

Talks easily about poop (e.g. reading a book about

Asks for a diaper/pull-up prior to pooping			
Admits to caregiver that has had an accident when asked			
Tells caregiver immediately after has an accident

Tells caregiver that will need to poop			

HOW REGULARLY DOES CAREGIVER

Ask child if they had an accident ("Did you poop in your pants?")			
Ask child about need to use bathroom ("Do you need to go?")			
<u>Prompt</u> child to go into bathroom ("Time to go into the bathroom")			
Talk/explain/process with child about poop or accidents			
Clean up child after accident			
Deal with mess of poop (e.g. wash clothes, throw away			
pull-up, throw away underwear, clean bathroom)			
Feel upset about accident and not show it			
Feel upset about accident and show it			
Allow child to return to preferred activity immediately after			
accident
